SCHOOL BACKGROUND

Anona is the oldest school in Pinellas County, and first was established on the site of the present Anona Methodist Church. In 1935, the Anona community approved a property tax to pay for a new school auditorium. Completed in 1938, the auditorium was equipped with 175 folding chairs. This same building houses Anona's school cafeteria and is the site of school celebrations. Anona now has more than 400 students. Three additions have been added. The school has 22 classrooms, a media center, a beautiful butterfly garden and a covered physical education court. Anona is a Literacy Success school, which gives students additional support in reading.
