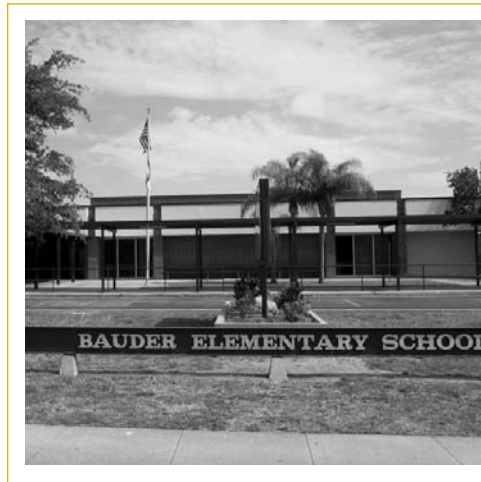

SCHOOL BACKGROUND

Bauder Elementary is located in Seminole, adjacent to Seminole Middle, Seminole High and Seminole Vocational Education Center. Bauder is an open-spaced facility that opened in 1972 for PreK through 5th grade. There are 39 classrooms, two gifted portables, two computer labs, two PreK exceptional education portables, three music and art portables, an outdoor classroom and a science lab. The large open-spaced classroom area is clustered around a large media center that also is used for small groups, tutoring and volunteers.
